The University of Northern Iowa, partner of the World Leisure Organization and home to the World Leisure Secretariat, is seeking a full professor in the Division of Leisure, Youth and Human Services; School of Health, Physical Education and Leisure Services; College of Education. The successful candidate will occupy the R. J. McElroy Professor of Youth Leadership Studies. The R. J. McElroy Professor is an endowed position focusing on issues and concerns related to youth. The position involves teaching, research and service in the areas of social policy, organizational leadership/management, philanthropy and foundations related to youth development.

Responsibilities: Development of a program of scholarship and research in area of specialty and the promotion of student research including the supervision of theses and dissertations; teaching at the undergraduate and graduate level with a focus on coursework in youth development, non-profit management, youth leadership and research/evaluation; continuation of a focused research agenda in the area of youth leadership studies/youth development; advising undergraduate and graduate students; public and community service activities related to youth leadership and youth development organizations; recruitment, counseling and career placement for undergraduate and graduate students; and supervision of the Institute for Youth Leaders.

Qualifications: Required: Doctoral degree; established record of research and scholarship; successful teaching experience at the university level, including the supervision of theses and/or dissertations; knowledge/experience in the non-profit youth/human service sector; and record of professional, university and community service. Required discipline/professional study area in one of the following areas: Human Services, Leisure Studies, Non-profit Development/Management, Youth Leadership Studies and/or Youth Development Studies. Evidence of significant community outreach and engagement with diverse stakeholders as reflected in scholarly and service endeavors also required. Demonstrated experience in seeking extramural funding including foundation funding required. Preferred: Experience in organizing and implementing youth development

programs and services.

Rank: Full Professor tenure-eligible appointment.

Salary and Benefits: Commensurate with qualification and experience. The University offers excellent fringe benefits including TIAA-CREF and IPERS retirement plans.
